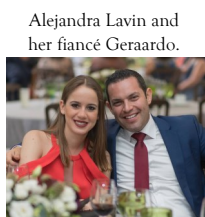

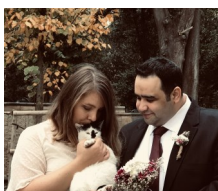
- **Zwelihle Mfundisi (2010)** was awarded a Stanford Graduate School of Business scholarship through the Stanford SEED program.

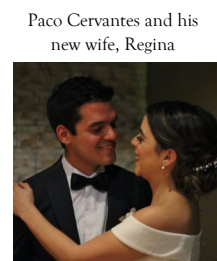
