MEET A CURRENT SCHOLAR

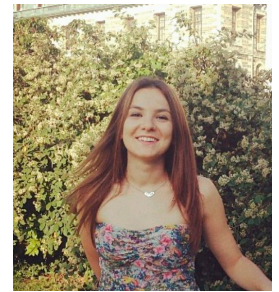
Sila Baştürk

The travel has brought to reality the extensive challenges the continent faces, as well as the opportunities. Martin West passed away in July 2015. He had many roles at University of Cape Town (UCT) as a Lecturer in Social Anthropology, rising to become Deputy Vice Chancellor of the University and ultimately spending 43 years with University of Cape Town.

Martin West played a facilitating role for the Gallagher Foundation from its earliest days of involvement with UCT and for a number of years participated actively on the panel for selection of new Gallagher Scholars. When he contracted Parkinson's Disease in 2006, he was forced into early retirement.

Jocelyn Gallegos Pérez (2012) was nominated Queen of Monterrey campus, and new director Council of Acciones por Mexico.

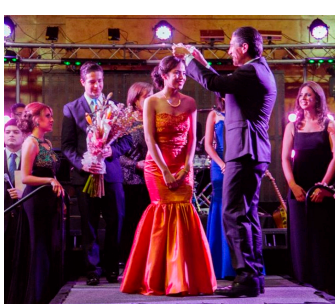

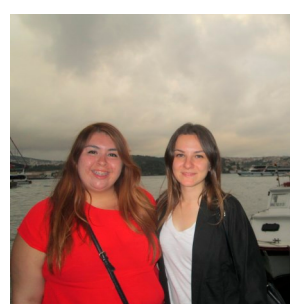

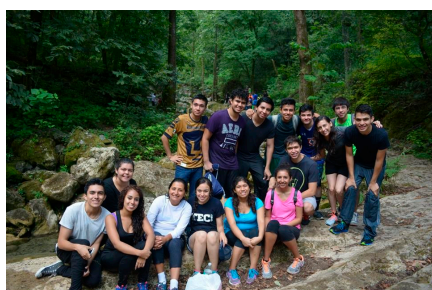
