

It is with a heavy heart that Ellen and I report our close friend and Foundation supporter, Mike Moore, died on October 26th as a result of a brain tumor. In 1998, at the invitation of Mike and his dear wife, Carol, we made our first visit to South Africa. During that trip our plan for a scholarship program began to take shape. Once Ellen and I had decided what we wanted to create, Mike played a pivotal role in supporting our efforts. He graciously hosted our initial candidate interviews in his Johannesburg office. The key leadership that has blessed our work for many years was established when Mike provided an introduction to Dave and Carol Schroenn. Through another Moore contact we were able to find the Career Wise organization which led to our highly productive, long-standing partnership with Monique Adams and Margaret Bennetts. Mike and Carol also funded the cost for two of our Scholars: Wayne Moodaley and Cele Mpumelelo and contributed to the scholarship for Ntoetse Lerotholi, which was established in memory of Mary Fangman. In addition to helping conduct the interviews three times in South Africa, the Moore's also interviewed once in Turkey. Ellen and I are deeply grateful to Mike and Carol and will miss Mike a great deal. Please remember Mike, Carol, their children and grandchildren in your prayers.

Ellen and I plan to visit Turkey later this month and Mexico in March of next year. We are looking forward to being with our current Scholars and graduated Scholars as well as interviewing talented candidates.
